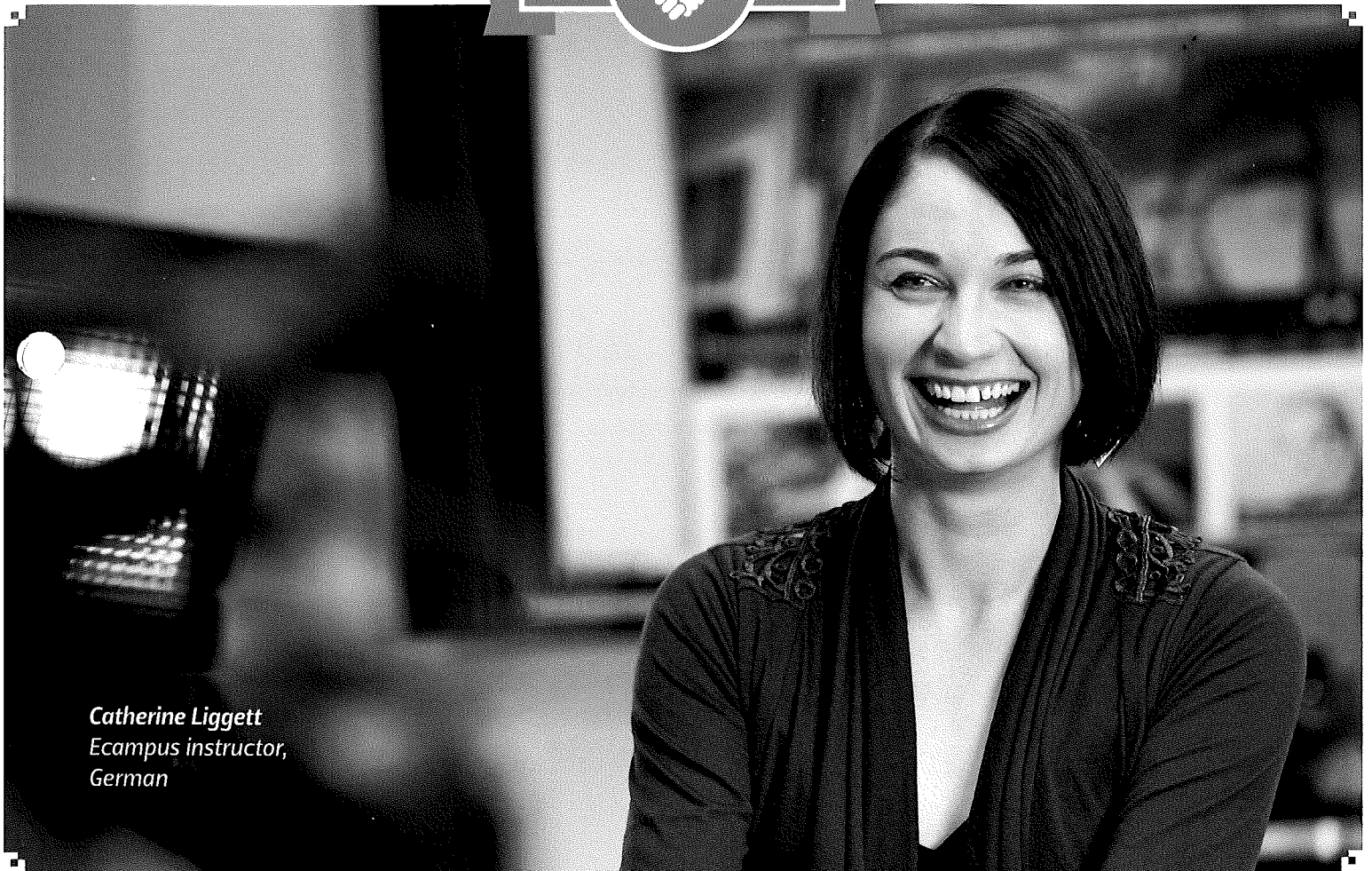

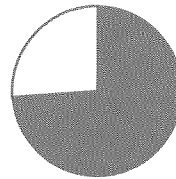
Online degrees & credit courses at OSU

ABOUT ONLINE EDUCATION

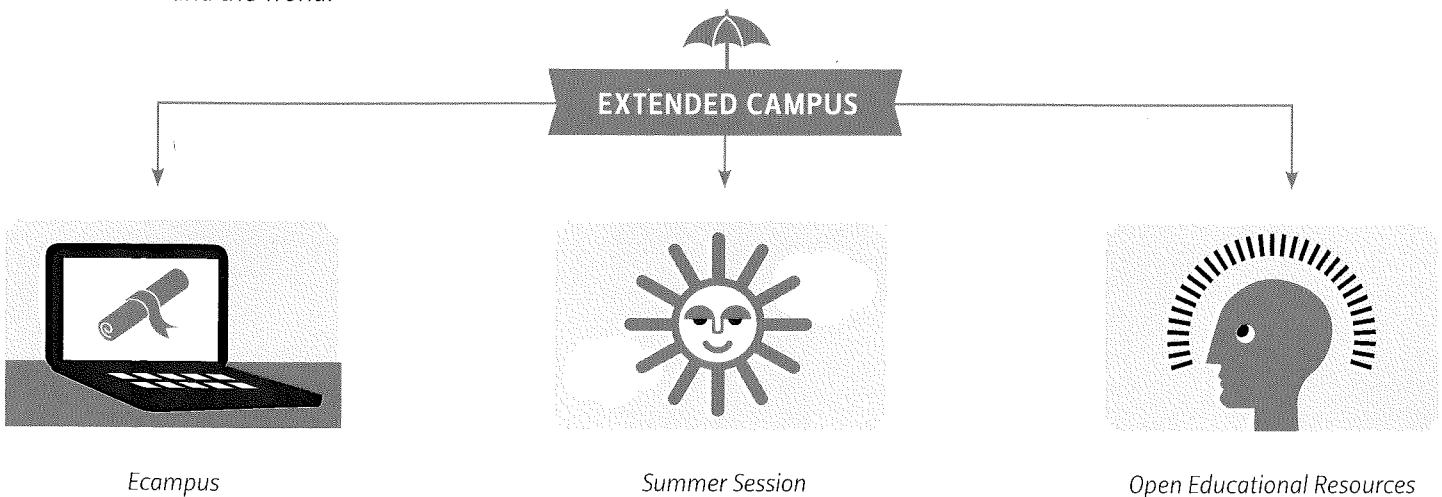

It does so with rigorous, engaging instructional methodologies that are proven to be successful. For its part, Oregon State consistently ranks among the nation's best online universities.



74 percent of academic leaders in 2013 rated the learning outcomes in online college courses as the same or superior to those in face-to-face courses, up from 57.2 percent in 2003.¹

OSU Ecampus is part of the Division of University Outreach and Engagement. It falls under the umbrella of Extended Campus. Extended Campus also houses **OSU Summer Session** and **Open Educational Resources and Emerging Technologies (OER)**, a unit that works with faculty to create open learning modules and enables them to share their expertise in digital media collections around the world.

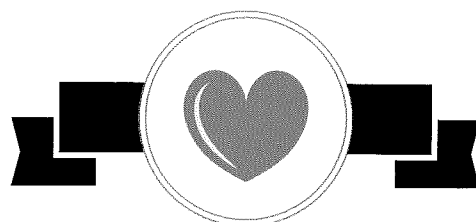
While the departments and faculty have oversight of the curriculum and instruction, Ecampus assists in everything from course development to the marketing of programs.

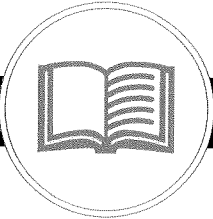

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COURSE DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

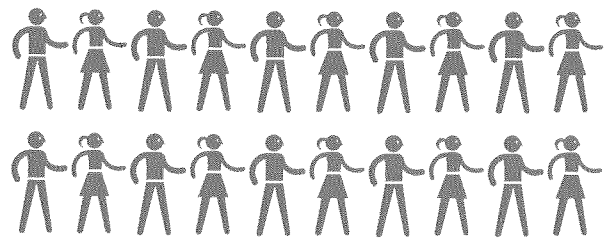

QM ONLINE COURSE DESIGN

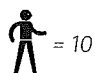
This Ecampus initiative seeks to improve student success by continuously improving online course design using the research-based Quality Matters (QM) peer review process. OSU faculty can also become peer reviewers. Ecampus conducts trainings year-round, and stipends are awarded when one reviews a peer's course.

ECAMPUS FACULTY FORUM

The Faculty Forum is an annual showcase of excellence in online teaching that gives faculty the opportunity to hear colleagues discuss innovative teaching methods and relate their experiences in online course development.

NEW OR UPDATED ONLINE COURSES

Proposals may be submitted by the department chair or an instructor with the chair's approval. Proposals are reviewed by the Ecampus Intake Team in consultation with program leads and department chairs, and they will be evaluated for funding on an ongoing basis.

2013-14 Online Course/Program offerings:

- Over 900 credit courses are available online in over 90 subjects
- 17 undergraduate degree programs and 18 undergraduate minors
- 19 graduate programs (some hybrid)
- Partner with 10 OSU academic colleges
- Partner with nearly 600 faculty members annually

2013-14 Student Demographics (distance students):

- Approximately 52% of distance students are women
- Approximately 30% of distance students live in Oregon
- Average age of distance students is 32
- Of the 15,470 students in Ecampus courses, 5,806 (38%) were distance students
- Of the 156,927 Ecampus credit hours, 84,015 (54%) were taken by distance students
- Distance students enrolled from all 50 states and from over 40 countries

Motivation for enrolling in online classes/programs:

- Stop outs – have started degree (frequently at OSU) but weren't able to finish
- Working adults – can't leave job to get degree and can't move to Corvallis
- Stay at home parents – want to be home with kids
- Preference is online learning
- On-campus course access issues
