

- Tenured faculty in 8 colleges
- 400 faculty and staff;
 2/3 live and work outside of Corvallis
- Presence in every county
- 25 of 36 counties have local tax support
- **7** program areas:
 - Agriculture and Natural Resources
 - Forestry and Natural Resources
 - Family and Community Health
 - 4-H Youth Development
 - Sea Grant
 - Open Campus
 - Outdoor School

- 2.3 million annual educational contacts
- 13,000 trained volunteers help deliver programs through "master" credentials (gardening, food preservation, woodland management, naturalists, beekeeping)
- 3,200 "Ask an Expert" questions answered
- Open Campus grows ties to K-12 and community colleges
 - Educational pathways-Juntos in 23 communities graduates 100% from high school and 92% post-secondary enrollment
