Oregon State Board of Trustees to meet July 8

CORVALLIS, Ore. – The Oregon State University Board of Trustees will hold a special meeting virtually via Zoom July 8 to consider approving a 10-year business forecast, a new student living center and a bond issuance for the student living center on the Corvallis campus.

The board is scheduled to meet from 1 to 2:10 p.m. via Zoom. The board's Academic Strategies Committee is set to meet from 2:10 to 2:45 p.m., also via Zoom.

The student living center project includes improvements to area infrastructure and an off-campus dining support facility. The total estimated budget is \$190 million. The new student living center will add 680 student beds and will be approximately 175,000 square feet.

The Academic Strategies Committee will consider approving several new degree programs.
