




The Oregon State University


Orange boxes show major budget types or units at Oregon State




INTO-OSU Joint Venture

Operations: \$543.2M Total









The State of Oregon remains an important partner to OSU, but the relative contribution of the State varies significantly across the university




Key Projects on OSU-Cascades Campus

Current debt service (including projects approved and in design) is at levels below the current State Board of Higher Education debt service limit of 7%.

Key Issues in Financial Management and Planning

- Enrollment management, tuition planning, cost of educational programs
- Tracking indices of financial health and status
- Capital planning, renewal, and debt management
- Space planning and management
- Integrated financial planning (E&G, auxiliaries, service centers, all operations)
- Appropriate financial controls and oversight
